Y3	Pankhurst	Emmeline Pankhurst was a British political activist. She is best remembered for organising the UK suffragette movement and helping women win the right to vote
Y3	Gandhi	Gandhi was an Indian lawyer, anti-colonial nationalist, and political ethicist, who employed non-violent resistance to lead the successful campaign for India's independence from British rule, and in turn inspired movements for civil rights and freedom across the world.
Y4	Mandela	Nelson Mandela was a South African anti-apartheid revolutionary and political leader who served as President of South Africa from 1994 to 1999. He was the country's first black head of state and the first elected in a fully representative democratic election
Y5	Seacole	Mary Seacole was a British-Jamaican nurse, healer and business woman who set up the "British Hotel" behind the lines during the Crimean War.
Y5	Darwin	Charles Darwin was an English naturalist, geologist and biologist, best known for his contributions to the science of evolution. His proposition that all species of life have descended over time from common ancestors is now widely accepted, and considered a foundational concept in science
Y6	Turing	Alan Turing OBE was an English mathematician, computer scientist, logician, cryptanalyst, philosopher, and theoretical biologist. He was a code-breaker in WW2.
Y6	Yousafzai	Malala Yousafzai often referred to as Malala, is a Pakistani activist for female education and the youngest Nobel Prize laureate.
