

The Romans - Take-Home tasks

This autumn's challenge is for you to complete **at least two** of the tasks below by the end of our topic. It would be amazing if you could do them all.
Just imagine how fantastic our displays will look with all your fabulous work on them!

<u>Roman Bath House model</u> Using a range of materials, your task is to build your own model of a Roman Bath House. Remember to include all the key features of the building (e.g. a fire, no windows etc) Your model can be whatever size you like although we may struggle to fit life-size houses in the classroom!	<u>Roman Soldier Poster</u> We have already started learning about Roman Soldiers. Can you make a poster labelling the different parts of the Roman soldiers' uniform and any other interesting facts you may find out? Make it as big and as bold as you can.	<u>Roman Mosaic</u> Use scrap materials to produce a Roman mosaic. You can use old magazines, bits of coloured card, fabrics or any other materials you can find. 	<u>Life of a famous Roman</u> Research the life of a famous Roman such as Julius Caesar, Augustus, Claudius or Hadrian. You can record your research however you like. It could be a fact file, a PowerPoint presentation or a mini booklet.
<u>Roman life fact file</u> Research more about the Romans. You might want to find out what foods they produced, how they cooked it, special clothing, different activities they enjoyed doing and how they made their weapons.	<u>Modern day Roman holiday</u> Plan a holiday to modern day Rome. Include how to get there and places to stay, eat and visit. You can use the internet to help you or you could even go to a travel agent and get some brochures to help you.	<u>Roman Invasion Map</u> Draw a map showing how the Romans travelled to England. 	<u>Count like an ancient Roman</u> What are Roman numerals? What do they look like? How do they work? Can you create a poster to the questions above? Can you make a 'Match the Number' game using Roman and Arabic (today's numbers) numerals?
