




Fifteen hours free 2 year old nursery provision in Carle Class Do you receive...

- income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Universal Credit, and your household income is £15,400 a year or less after tax, not including benefit
 payments
- child tax credits, and your household income is £16,190 a year or less before tax
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- the Working Tax Credit 4-week run on (the payment you get when you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Is your child looked after by a local authority
- have a statement of <u>special education needs (SEN)</u> or an education, health and care plan (EHCP)
- get Disability Living Allowance
- have left care under an adoption order, special guardianship order or a child arrangements order

If the answer is yes to any of the benefits above, then your 2-year-old is entitled to fifteen hours free 2 year old nursery provision in Carle class at school.
