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Brighton & Hove Schools Cross Country Championships

It was a glorious, sunny afternoon and, with over 1000 runners representing 42 schools across Brighton & Hove, the atmosphere was electric!

Our team did the school and themselves proud, with superb, gutsy performances all round. First up was the Year 5 boys race, with Will, Rocky and Freddie running for Rudyard. Lining up alongside hundreds of others, there were plenty of nerves, but the three boys did brilliantly, Will and Rocky finishing in the top 100.

Next, it was the turn of Talia, Mia and Scarlett, our Year 5 girls. Against some tough competition, the girls showed great poise and persistence, Mia finishing just outside the top 50 and Talia with an outstanding run to come in 25th out of 250 runners – what an achievement!

Our Year 6 boys and girls were not to be outdone, though. Ernie, Sonny, Oscar, Ewan and Thomas ran their socks off, with Sonny and Oscar both coming in the top 100 in their age group. To round off proceedings, Ava, Eliza S, Isla and Darcie were all stars, fighting to the very end to secure Rudyard three more top 100 finishes.

It was a joy for Mr Mack, Mr Wynne and the children's parents/carers to witness the effort and resilience of our team of runners being rewarded with so many successes. But it was Darcie who best summed up the feeling of the day when, hurtling round the final bend, she shouted "I'm having so much fun!" We all did, Darcie!

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In History we have been learning about Nelson Mandela and how he helped to fight for equality in South Africa.



In Year 2 we've learnt:

As Nelson Mandela was growing up, he noticed that Black people were not treated equally. He believed that everybody should be treated the same and so he started taking action. Unfortunately, Nelson Mandela was unfairly put in a prison called Robben Island for the actions he took. After being in prison for 27 years, Nelson Mandela was let out and started seeking change in a peaceful way. This involved anti-Apartheid protests. At the age of 77, Nelson Mandela then became South Africa's first Black president and was finally able to put an end to Apartheid!

This week we wrote a diary entry pretending to be Nelson Mandela whilst he was imprisoned at Robben Island.

Reminder: Taking holidays during term-time

Now the Government have eased travelling restrictions, you **cannot** take your child out of school during term time to go on a family holiday unless:

- You, the parent the child normally lives with, get permission from the school before you go on holiday
- There are exceptional circumstances, such as an illness or a funeral of a person close to the family, which you will need to prove to the school

We will be fining all unauthorised holidays. You will be fined £60 per parent, per child.


