


# Thank you to The Lions!

KSI - Freddie in Rashford being more confident and mixing really well with the other children.



## Reminder: Taking holidays during term-time

Now the Government have eased travelling restrictions, you **cannot** take your child out of school during term time to go on a family holiday unless:

- You, the parent the child normally lives with, get permission from the school before you go on holiday
- There are exceptional circumstances, such as an illness or a funeral of a person close to the family, which you will need to prove to the school

We will be fining all unauthorised holidays. You will be fined £60 per parent, per child.


