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Headteacher Reports...

Without question, one of the very best parts of my job is having the privilege of eating in our dining halls each day with the children. This week, I have been enjoying excellent conversation with many of our KS2 children and next week I will be doing the same with some of our younger children. Eating lunch together provides children with such vital life skills including listening and turn taking. I must report that our school Value of Respect was very much in evidence when I ate lunch with some of our older children every day this week: children listened respectfully to each other when they spoke. RKPS children are very much a credit to their families at home!

It is always interesting to discover which subjects our children enjoy the most and why. At the Year 4 lunch table I ate at yesterday, the results were: Maths 2; P.E 2; Art 2; Science I and English I! Over the many lunches I have enjoyed with our children, Mathematics would definitely appear to be a big favourite of RKPS children. To have such a love of maths from such a young age can only bode well for the future as we all know that mathematicians can be very successful out there in the big wide world!

Next Thursday, March 3rd, is World Book Day: the theme for which is on the beach so I'll for digging out my best Hawaiian shirt! We are looking forward to seeing lots of colourful outfits that day. I am delighted that we have been able to arrange for our children to enjoy The Wizard of Oz show on the afternoon of World Book Day itself with a 1:30pm start: the West End will come to RKPS, Woodingdean!

We have returned to holding whole school assemblies live after the short pause before half term and some of our free clubs have started too: there was some expert coding taking place with Miss Guthrie and Miss Ghattas after school on Wednesday! Messy Mondays and Family Fridays continue as always and I cannot recommend these enough for any parents, babies and toddlers who want to have a fun packed hour and a half.
