


The Little Wooden Robot and the Log Princess by Tom Gauld

One day their wish is finally granted and with the help of a kind witch and clever inventor, they get their very own wooden little robot boy and log princess. The two children were the best of friends and the family were so happy together. However, there was one catch, every night the little Princess turns back into a wooden log and has to be woken by her brother with magic words. One day, whilst her brother is distracted by a circus, the maid sees the log on the

bed and throws it out the window not realising that it was in fact the princess! The robot then goes on desperate and challenging mission to get his sister back!

This is such a wonderful new fairytale. Both the illustrations and story line hook you straight in and keep you engaged throughout. In class, we celebrated our differences and recognised that we are all different in our own unique way and in our own right.
