


School Uniform

This week in Reception we have been learning about disability. We read a book called, 'What Happened to You'. This book is about a boy called Joe, who has only one leg, and how the other 'kids' try to guess what had happened to his other leg. Eventually, they stop asking because they start to play 'pirates' with Joe and forget that he has one leg. We also agreed that it doesn't matter what happened to his leg as we are all different but the same on the inside. We discussed how it might feel to be Joe and how it didn't stop him from doing the things he wanted to do. To try to get an understanding of how it must feel not to have one or both legs, we played a game of Sit-Down Volleyball. Although the children thought it was fun, Henry said "It didn't matter that we couldn't use our legs but it was easier to get the ball with legs."






School Uniform - Navy Polo Shirts
