


Malala Yousafzai: 'Our books and our pens are the most powerful weapons'

Year 6 found out about the inspirational Malala Yousafzai!



Malala was a girl who loved to learn but was told that girls would no longer be allowed to go to school. She wrote a blog that brought attention to what was happening in her beautiful corner of Pakistan and realised that words could bring about change. Malala is the youngest person ever to win the Nobel Peace Prize and has become well known in the international community for her diary about life under Taliban rule.

 If the Head of Key Stage is unable to advise to rectify the issue, this can then be escalated to the Deputy Headteacher or SENCO if your child has additional needs.

Headteacher

 If the Deputy Headteacher/SENCO is unable to advise or rectify the issue, this can then be escalated to the Headteacher.

Chair of Governors

 If the Headteacher is unable to advise or rectify the issue, the matter can then be escalated to the Chair of Governors.

Rudyard Reading Recommendations


Hello all, every week the English Team and various adults around school share two reading recommendations for you and your lovely children to read.

Reading Research Alert:

Children who read (or who are read to) at least 20 minutes a day are exposed to almost 2 million words per year.

Companion picture book to Breathe like a Bear that helps kids feel calm and ready to meet new classmates!

This adorable picture book shows kids how to handle their first-day-ofschool nerves through relaxing breathing practices. Kids can use these breathing techniques whenever they feel stressed or anxious. Cute animal characters and the relatable story make this the perfect readaloud before returning to the classroom.

Bear can't wait to go to her first day of school. But she and a few of her friends are also feeling a little anxious. Luckily, Owl has the perfect words for them all to say to calm the jitters and help them recognize the similarities we share under the trappings of our uniqueness.

Introducing a mantra for first-day—and any-day—worries, Breathe Like a Bear: First-Day-of-School Worries uses an easy-to-follow breathing exercise, mindful prompts, and a soothing mantra that will help kids navigate their anxiety long after the final page. This prescriptive and teachable picture book is an invaluable tool for every child's early social-emotional education.


