
#### Willis


Hello all, every week the English Team and various adults around school share two reading recommendations for you and your lovely children to read.

#### The Lost Whale by Hannah Gold & illustrated by Levi Pinfold




From the author of the best-selling The Last Bear comes another incredible chapter book about the connection between a boy and a whale and the bond that sets them both free.

THEIR BOND COULD SET THEM FREE . . .



But everything changes when he joins a whale-watching trip and meets White Beak, a gentle giant of the sea. Rio forms an instant bond with the whale, and for the first time in ages he feels a spark of hope. Then White Beak goes missing and Rio may be the only person who can help.

Can Rio draw on their special connection to somehow find and save his whale . . .

Gold covers topics such as mental health, physical health and environmental issues with tact and sensitivity, while weaving a heart-warming tale that will probably become a household favourite. Beautiful, almost dream-like illustrations by Levi Penfold are scattered throughout.

We politely ask that parents do not smoke outside or near the school. We wish for all our children and families to breathe in clean air and for our school to be a healthy environment. Thank you for your support.


