The 'Times Table Challenge' is a traditional feature of our Monday morning assembly with the esteemed Times Table trophy up for grabs.

Each week, two children pit their wits against each other as they answer questions on a times table/s of their choice. When a child has mastered all of their times tables, they are able to put themselves forward to take part in the 'ultimate' challenge, when they answer random questions on every times table all the way up to 12x12.

The expectation is that all children know their times tables by the end of Year 4: by doing so, it helps them enormously with so many other aspects of mathematics. I am delighted that more and more of our children are learning their times tables off by heart and this week Leo (Year 2) and Jack (Year 3) took part in the 'ultimate' challenge with both young mathematicians showing that they really are times table masters! Thank you to those parents who are helping their child practise their times tables at home, supporting the work we do in school.

When I talk to the children about which subjects they enjoy most, maths is a frequent response-it's great that so many of our children have a natural love of maths-it's such a fantastic subject.

The majority of parents and carers have booked their Parent/Carer Consultations appointments for October 15th and 16th. These are an opportunity for you to find out how your child is progressing in maths and other key areas. You will also have the opportunity to look through your child's books and find out how your child is settling into the new school year. If you haven't yet booked, please contact the office.

Rocket's little superstar is at it again!




You are working so hard and making amazing progress. It has been a joy to see your handwriting come along so well. Keep up the incredible work.

Arthur






"Students who read for pleasure make significantly more progress in vocabulary, spelling and maths than children who read very little." Sullivan and Brown 2013

This picturebook takes the form of a dialogue between Nelson Mandela's daughter Zindzi and her grandchildren Zazi and Ziwelene during which she answers their questions about his life and the struggle against apartheid. The illustrations are by an African American artist whose work explores history, race and identity.

Race to the Frozen North. The Matthew Henson Story



Penniless and shoeless, I I-year-old Matt leaves home and walks to Washington DC in search of a new life. Taken in by the kindly Janey, he helps in her café. But, entranced by a customer's tales of adventure on the high seas, Matt starts to dream of sailing the world. As he sets off to find work on a ship, little does he know of the deep challenges he'll face and the incredible things he'll achieve.

Because of the colour of his skin, Matt has to work harder than everyone else to get half as far. But by the time he's twenty, he's travelled the world, is a master carpenter and speaks several languages. On land, though, nobody cares. Then he meets Officer Peary, a man with a great ambition: to find the North Pole. Matt's skills and abilities will prove essential to Peary's endeavours – but will he get the recognition he deserves?

Based on the story of real-life 19th-century explorer Matthew Henson, Catherine Johnson's light touch makes this remarkable story an exciting read and sheds important light on the way prejudice has white-washed the way we learn about the past....


