


Hello all, every week the English Team and various adults around school share two reading recommendations for you and your lovely children to read.

Tisha and the Blossom by Wendy Meddour and illustrated by Daniel Egneus




Companion picture book to Breathe like a Bear that helps kids feel calm and ready to meet new classmates!



Reading volunteers needed!

If you can spare an hour (or more!) per week to work with children across the school, supporting them in their reading, we would LOVE to hear from you! If you have been a member of the Reading Support Network before and would like to re-join then please do!

This important voluntary role will not only develop your understanding of how children learn to read, but will make a massive difference to their reading progress.

How can I do this?

- · Please contact the office with the day(s) and times (am or pm)
- · We will need to complete a DBS form on your behalf, which is completely free. In order to complete a DBS we need to see three forms of current ID. Below is a list of documentation that we can accept.

We'd love to have your support helping our children become lifelong readers.

We look forward to hearing from you.

Some examples of ID include:

- Current valid Passport
- Current Driving Licence (UK) (Full or provisional) Isle of Man /Channel
- Birth Certificate (UK & Channel Islands) issued at the time of birth; (full or short form acceptable including those issued by UK authorities overseas, such as Embassies, High Commissions and HM Forces)
- Mortgage Statement (UK or EEA) (issued within the past 12 months).
- Bank/Building Society Statement (UK and Channel Islands or EEA) (less
- than three months old).
- Credit Card Statement (UK or EEA) (less than three months old)
- Financial Statement e.g. pension, endowment, ISA (UK) (issued within
- the past 12 months)
- P45/P60 Statement (UK & Channel Islands) (issued within the past 12 months)
- Council Tax Statement (UK & Channel Islands) (issued within the past 12 months)
- Utility Bill (UK) Not Mobile Telephone (less than three months old)
