We have a long established reading culture here at Rudyard and our children are taught a love of reading from the moment they set foot in our Nursery. We are proud to be a local authority school, working with other Brighton and Hove schools to help raise standards for all our city's children.





Written by James Carter, Illustrated by Nicola Colton



KS2 Recommendation

Call me lion. Written by Camilla Chester



Call Me Lion is a heart-warming children's novel by Camilla Chester about Leo, a ten-year-old boy with Selective Mutism who dreams of dancing in the West End. His loneliness during a summer heatwave is broken when he befriends his chatty new neighbour, Richa. As their friendship grows, they discover each other's secrets and support each other in overcoming their fears to achieve their dreams. The book explores themes of courage, true friendship, and compassion, and was written and portrayed authentically with help from families affected by selective mutism to promote awareness and positive representation.
