Amina





Henry H





Arbor messages




However, there are occasions when events or urgent updates need to be shared separately.


Hello all, every week the English Team and various adults around school share two reading recommendations for you and your lovely children to read.

Merry Whatmas? (Hedgehog & Friends) by Eoin McLaughlin and illustrated by Polly Dunbar




Hedgehog and Tortoise are celebrating their first Christmas but do not really understand what it is.
