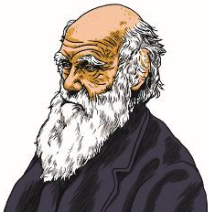

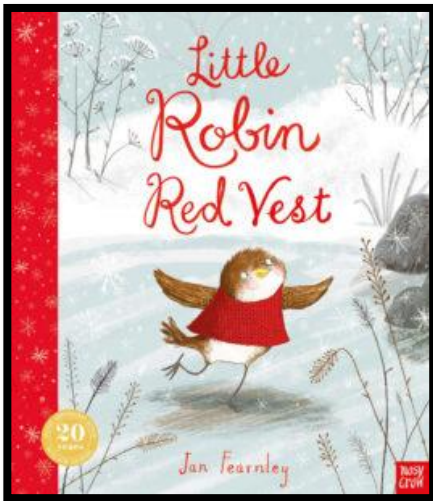
## Rudyard Reading Recommendations

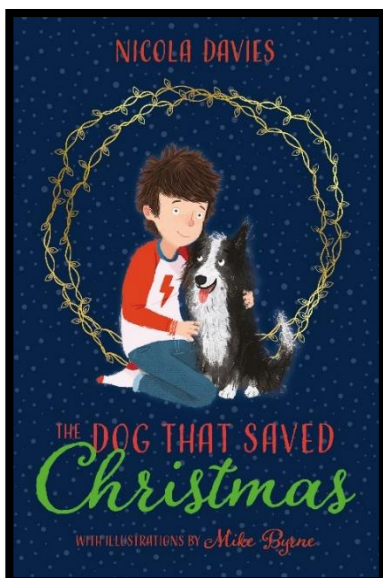
### *Little Robin Red Vest by Jan Fearnley*



A charming picture book about the joy of giving that has the feel of a gentle Just-So story with a festive twist. It is the week before Christmas and it's getting chilly outside. Little Robin washes and irons seven warm vests to keep him cosy in the frosty evenings leading up to Christmas.

As each day goes by, Robin encounters a different shivering animal and, full of compassion, he generously offers each animal one of his own vests to wear. Robin's kindness may have prevented his animal friends from getting colder, but when Christmas eve arrives he finds himself with nothing warm left to wear. Fortunately, a festive visitor in a red suit and a soft, white beard spots Robin and finds a joyous way to reward him for his kindness to others. The tale is likely to inspire children to tap into the spirit of giving that Robin demonstrates so unreservedly.

For equalities week, we explored how our brains are all different, and shared things that our brains are good at (learning as well as characteristics and hobbies), as well as things our brains find trickier. We then looked at how we feel when we are faced with things we find tricky, and explored the comfort, growth and panic zones. We also looked at how we find things tricky on the playground, and explored tools to regulate. These included journalling, positive affirmations, listening to music and walking away safely. The children then created their individualized toolkit. We plan to return to this in the new year so that strategies are fresh in our minds, and continue the 'homework' of learning to believe our positive affirmations to enable us to be the happiest and most confident versions of ourselves.

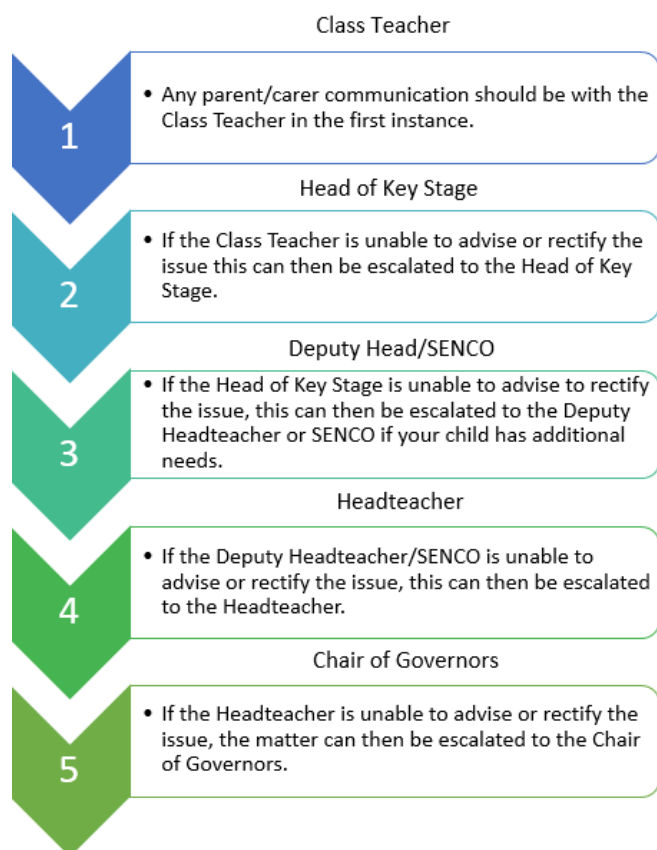


## Salvation Army Donation
